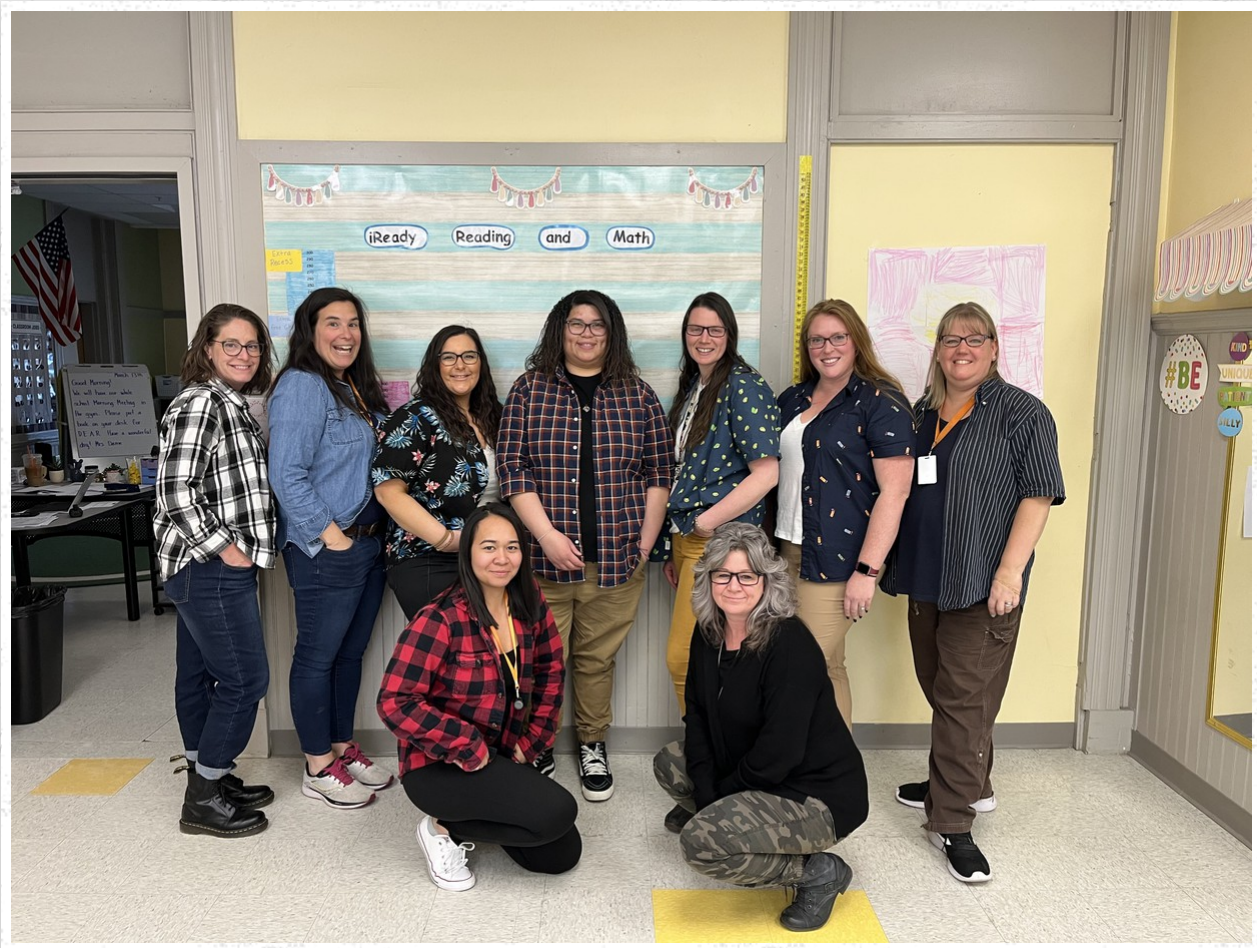

NEW HAMPSHIRE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

The New Hampshire Department of Education values your feedback and wants to hear from you!

The 603 Bright Futures Survey is an opportunity to hear from you, your staff, your families, and your communities. The survey will gather actionable feedback around learning models, school climate, family and community engagement, as well as other topics in order to understand the successes and challenges of the recent school year and plan for the upcoming 2023-2024 school year. The survey will also gather special education family data in support of NHED's federal reporting requirements for Indicator 8.

The survey, which is available in English and Spanish, will be open from March 13 to April 28. School staff, families, and community members will be able to take the survey online, which will take less than 15 minutes to complete. Panorama Education is supporting us with the 603

Bright Futures Survey, and it welcomes any questions pertaining to the survey program.
