Good afternoon,

The School District is moving quickly toward the implementation of our distance model program. Our district is in a great position to move forward with this process because of the forward thinking of your school board and the efforts of our teachers to take advantage of our resources. It is our intention to begin the process of distance learning on Thursday March 19. The first two days will be a test to see what works and what does not work. As of Monday March 23rd we should be ready for full implementation.

Parents can pick up materials for their students as follows:

LCS- Thursday academic packets can be picked up in the main office between 8AM to 3PM.

FRES- Tuesday, academic materials including packets, books and Chromebooks can be picked up in the gym between 12:30 and 2:30. (If you cannot be there during this time period, please let us know.)

WLC- Wednesday, academic materials including packets, books and Chromebooks can be picked up between 8AM and 6PM.

The District is waiting for some information on food service from the state and federal government on how this should be done. We will get back to you as soon as possible.

More information will be coming from case managers on delivering special education services.

As we begin this process I would again suggest the following:

Set up a time for school work.

Pre K to 1-	formally one hour or so with another hour or so of interactive play with your child. Reading time everyday
Grades 2-5	formally two to three hours with interactive play with your child for an hour. Student reading time every day for 30-60 minutes
Grade 6-12	formally three hour of formal time, 30-60 minutes of reading, 30-60 minutes of conversation with your student on topics of the day (there are a few)
All grades	60-90 minutes of activity outside (weather permitting)

As parents, we will need your help in making sure that students are participating while at home and getting the most out of this new reality.

We will keep sharing information with you as we move forward. Together we will make this work.
