THE COMMUNITY

According to the Town Profiles of 2014 Wilton had a population of 3,679 and the population of Lyndeborough was 1,633 people. The area has an expanding population with an economic base gained from local industries, orchard, dairy, and agricultural farming. Local industries include: Label Art, Kimball Physics, Souhegan Wood Products, Cutting Tool Technologies, and the Hitchiner Manufacturing Corporation.

THE SCHOOL

Wilton-Lyndeborough Cooperative Middle/High School located in Wilton, New Hampshire first opened in 1969. The school serves students from the rural towns of Wilton and Lyndeborough in grades 6-12. It is accredited by the New Hampshire Department of Education and the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Wilton-Lyndeborough Cooperative has an enrollment of 157 students in grades 9-12, and 123 students in grades 6-8 for a total of 280. The faculty consists of 58 individuals.

THE CURRICULUM

The students of WLC are provided with a quality and comprehensive education that focuses on the mastery of basic skills, while, allowing students to pursue their individual interests. The school offers 66 courses in varying levels of difficulty. Students may elect to take online courses through Virtual High School or Virtual Learning Academy Charter School. WLC students are also able to participate in courses offered through the career and technical programs at Milford High School, Mascenic Regional High School and Contoocook Valley Regional High School (Con-Val).

Advanced Placement and Honors: WLC currently offers two AP courses: English Literature & Composition and AP U.S. History. The following courses have been designated as Honors: Honors World Literature, Honors The Individual in Society, Honors American Literature, Honors British Literature, Honors Algebra I, Honors Algebra II, Honors Algebra II, Honors Geometry, Honors Pre-Calculus, Honors Calculus, Honors Physical Science, Honors Biology, Honors Chemistry, Honors Physics, Honors World History, AP U.S. History, Honors U.S. History, Honors U.S. Government & Economics. Honors students may elect to take the AP exam to receive college credit.

24 Hours Service Learning

eStart: eStart is a dual credit program that affords NH high school students the opportunity to take 100% online college courses through the Community College System of New Hampshire (CCSNH), while earning both high school AND college credit simultaneously.

Running Start: The Running Start program allows high school students to take Community College System of NH (CCSNH) courses for high school AND college credit while still in high school. The following courses are offered at WLC: College Composition 101, Introduction to Statistics and Basic Human Anatomy & Physiology.

Senior Project - Is the individual pursuit of a topic of particular interest. It is a demonstration of the senior's ability to learn independently from a variety of resources, while guided by a Mentor. This project encourages students to use their critical thinking skills and creativity, while also strengthening their sense of autonomy and commitment to lifelong learning.

Service Learning - Service learning is a yearly requirement for students at WLC, based on the belief that students should play an active role in their communities. Students must complete 6 hours of service per year for graduation. WLC's service learning component promotes respect and caring while building self-esteem and a connection to the community.

Competency Based Grading

Beginning with the 2015-2016 school year, WLC implemented Competency-Based Grading as mandated by the State of New Hampshire Department of Education.

Report Cards are generated for S1 and S2 (S2 will contain Year-Long Grades and Credits Earned)

Passing a class with traditional grades does not mean that a student will receive credit for the course. Competencies override the traditional grades when determining course credit. Traditional grades will still be used to calculate GPA, and for transcripts.

Competency is defined as the ability of a student to demonstrate required content knowledge and skills for each course. The purpose of a competency based grading system is to improve student achievement by focusing student learning on the essential skills and content necessary for each course and is based on a pattern of student work. The competency based structure more accurately reflects a students' level of understanding. Each competency aligns with the standards as outlined in the Common Core State Standards and in other national and New Hampshire standards as they apply to a specific course.

Throughout each course students receive a letter grade and a competency based grade based on their level of proficiency. The learning process continues throughout a course. Quarter grades are a snapshot of student progress at that time and are not reported on the transcript. At the end of the course, students receive an overall letter grade based on the average of the final course competency scores. This letter grade will be used to generate GPA and class rank.

Class Rank

Class rank is determined by a quality point system and is weighted. The higher the level, the more the more points awarded for the same grade. AP and Honors courses carry an additional .4 above College Prep classes.

GPA Levels

WLC uses a weighted grading scale.
