PreSchool News

Our Preschool and PreK students enjoyed a month of learning and fun! In April, the themes were eggs, bunnies, and baby animals. During Circle Time, we read many books including,

Cows by Kate Riggs, *Pigs* by Quinn M. Arnold, *Ducks* by Jennifer Szymanski, and *Going on an Egg Hunt* by Mayer-Johnson.

At the Art Center, the students were busy painting, practicing their scissor skills, and working together. As part of the egg theme, the students created egg sun catchers, sponge painted eggs, and colored eggs. As part of the bunnies and baby animals theme, the children painted pigs and chicks, and created cows by cutting black paper. Our bulletin board was complete once we added a sun that was painted and cut out by the Preschool and PreK students.

While at the Dramatic Play Center, the students were bakers and customers at the Preschool Bakery. They baked a variety of sweet treats, filled out order forms, and counted dollar bills. At the Sensory Table, the children searched the green grass to look for hidden eggs, bunnies, and numbers. During Math Time, the Preschool students matched egg patterns. The PreK students extended and created their own egg patterns, played an egg game, and practiced identifying numbers 0-20. The students ended the week before vacation with an egg hunt, as they practiced counting and recognizing names.

During Literacy and Writing, the Preschool students practiced tracing their first names and drawing shapes. The PreK students enjoyed the Handwriting Without Tears program as they learned that you "always start at the top" when writing numbers and letters. In this program, letters and numbers are written using big lines, little lines, big curves, and little curves.

Next month, we will be focusing on how fruits and vegetables grow, as well as caterpillars and butterflies.

We are looking forward to seeing our 4th grade Reading Buddies one last time this year and our chance to see the book fair. The classrooms will be full of excitement as the year comes to an end. We will meet the first grade teachers on Step-Up Day. It will be sad to see the children go, but they are very excited about becoming first graders soon!


We are learning how to collect data and create bar graphs in math this month. We are also learning how to interpret this data and make comparisons. We will be studying geom-


etry in our next math unit.





the weather. Put on bug spray or sunscreen before arriving as we cannot apply either to a student.







In math, we will be moving into geometry and measurement, but don't forget about those pesky multiplication facts! We are still working on mastering through the 12s tables. We





Happy Spring! Before we know it school will be out and summer will be here. As much as we all welcome the warmer weather, with it often comes more activities to fit into already busy schedules. Even though the school year is coming to a close, all students need to continue practicing their reading and math skills that they have learned throughout the year. Here are some suggestions to help lessen summer boredom while supporting your student's academic success. Have a wonderful summer!

Designate 20 minutes a day for reading time. Whether students read independently, to someone or something, or even if you read to them – reading for 20 minutes a day greatly increases your students success with reading and in school overall.

Try out a new app, website, or podcast. Many students have access to different devices at home and at the library. The web offers several opportunities for students to expand their skills. Sites like *Storynory* and *Khan Academy Kids* app offer great stories and lots of activities for kids. Podcasts like *The Alien Adventures of Finn Caspien* and *Story Pirates* are an exciting way to experience a story as well.

Pack a bag of books and math facts flashcards for the car. Most of us spend at least an hour in the car every day. Use this bag as your traveling school survival kit. Students can read or practice their math facts when riding in the car. They can use the materials while waiting for appointments or for their meal at a restaurant. This survival kit could also include crossword puzzles, math puzzles, or any other fun learning activity which can help not only keep your student on track academically, but also busy and entertained when you are away from home.

Listen to a book. Audio books are a great way for your whole family to enjoy a good book. Audio books are often on loan at the local library, or can even be downloaded to different devices. These are great for trips in the car!

Play board or card games. Springtime always has some rain, and a great way to spend a raining afternoon is playing board or card games with your family. Most games expect players to read, reason, or perform math related tasks. Game time shows students that reading and math skills are not used just in school.


