WLC celebrates academic achievement each quarter. Students are recognized for their academic grades, but also for their hard work, determination, and improvement. High school students are awarded Honor Roll (all As and Bs) and High Honor Roll (all As) per semester. Middle School students can earn those same honors but on a quarterly basis.

Each month, two students in grades 6, 7, and 8 and selected as the Student of the Month. This is a recognition for students who show random acts of kindness and who go above and beyond inside the classroom. Additionally, two students in either grade 9, 10, 11, or 12 are selected as Student(s) of the Month.

In May of their graduating year, seniors attend an Awards Night where local scholarships and academic awards are presented to seniors. In May of 2025, the graduating senior class received over \$100,000 in scholarships!







Grade 10 takes the PSAT 10



Savings on Running Start
Programs-Enroll in one or more!

Last year, students at Wilton-Lyndeborough Cooperative High School earned 69 college credits by taking Running Start courses. Compared to in-state UNH tuition of approximately \$1,940 per class, this represents a potential savings of **\$133,860** to WLC students and their families.

Running Start courses are college-level courses offered simultaneously at New Hampshire Community Colleges and at local high schools. High schools interested in offering Running Start courses must gain approval from their regional NH community college. The high school must have an instructor who is qualified to teach at the college level, and a curriculum that meets or exceeds the college's requirements and standards. In order to ensure that these standards are being honored, the high school teachers are observed during the course by a supervising professor from the college. Students who take approved Running Start courses are technically enrolled at both the high school and at the college - and simultaneously earn high school and college credit with a grade of C or better.

In an effort to maximize this great opportunity for its students, WLC has continued to add and promote the Running Start program. The school offers 5 Running Start math courses (Calculus 1, Calculus 2, Precalculus, Intro to Statistics, Quantitative Reasoning) and 2 Running Start English courses (College Composition 1, College Composition 2). In total, since WLC started offering Running Start courses in 2016, students have earned 296 college course credits, for a potential tuition savings of **\$574,240** in today's dollars.

Career & Technology Education (CTE)

Wilton-Lyndeborough is partnered with Milford High School, Mascenic High School, and ConVal High School to attend "CTE" programs. Most programs lead to at least one type of certification as part of the program completion. These "CTE" programs are considered electives and students in grades 10 through 12 are eligible to enroll!

The school community will begin a self-study during next school year for the upcoming Collaborative Conference visit during the Spring of 2027. Some of our 2024-2025 accomplishments include:

- Math tutoring after school 17 MS and HS students came in throughout the year to work on math
