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13	Chair Jeff Jones called the meeting to order at 7:14 pm
14	Chair Jones then proceeded to set the ground rules for the presentation:
15 16 17 18	<ol> <li>Jeff Jones will present the presentation in about 15-20 minutes representing nine months of work on the budget.</li> <li>Questions from the public will follow the presentation</li> <li>Two warrant articles will be presented but not discussed.</li> </ol>
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20 21 22 23	The meeting was interrupted at 7:16 PM with the realization that people listening online could not hear the speaker. The technicians worked diligently to get the system working properly, employing several configurations with some start and stop moments. At 7:29 the meeting resumed with Jeff Jones once again stating the ground rules.
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25	The presentation began at 7:33 and ended at 7:48 (slides available online).
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27	Chair Jones called for comments from the committee.
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Michelle Alley spoke explaining that she and her family are grateful to be here and

appreciate the schools and the teachers. She explained that as a School Board liaison

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31 to the Budget Committee with voting privileges, she voted NO for the SRO Warrant 32 Article, feeling its financially unsound, but as a School Board member, she voted YES 33 for the SRO Warrant Article to support the views of the public. 34 35 **Public Comments** 36 37 Fran Bujak - Lyndeborough: thanked the Budget Committee for its work, would like 38 more clarity on reducing FTE and if that would have an impact on education. He went 39 on to say that salaries in the presentation should show the last five years and not just 40 the last big increase. Taxes over the last 10 years have gone up just 13%, so that's 41 1.3% per year which someone moving to the district would find reasonable. 42 (Kristi LaPlante replied with explanations about the capital reserve. Adam reiterated that NH is the last of the 50 states receiving State funding for education.). 43 44 Karen Brickel (?) - Lyndeborough: Congratulated the school on moving up from the 45 lowest rating to number 39 out of 87 in the state. She wonders why we have three 46 schools when all the current students would fit in one school. (the school board would 47 need to address this, but in the past parents didn't like the idea of younger kids being together with the older kids). 48 49 Charlie Post - Lyndeborough: States the "lots of people" want the budget lower, closer 50 to the rate of inflation (the rate of inflation was not defined). He wondered if the budget 51 committee had looked into structural changes such as tuitioning the students out to 52 other school districts. 53 (It was explained that the budget committee does not drive the structure of the school 54 district and that tuitioning kids out usually results in more money than keeping them in 55 town, plus parents lose the opportunity to have a say in the classroom.) 56 57 Fran Bujak - Lyndeborough spoke again in response to Charlie Posts suggestion of 58 consolidating schools by forcing a \$400,000.00 budget cut. Mr. Bujak, who was on the 59 School Board for 15 years, gave a brief history of how WLC was formed and said they 60 looked in to moving the administration to another location, but space was hard to come 61 by and costs were high. He reminded everyone that a big, unexpected budget cut was 62 done four years ago with dire results. 63 (Jonathan Vanderhoof asked isn't it valuable to revisit the ideas of school consolidation 64 and out of district tuitioning). Mr. Bujak agreed it is valuable to investigate options every 65 3-5 years, looking at the facts and devising a plan. It is not valuable or useful to simply

66 slash a budget and expect a good outcome. (Adam Lavallee added that Milford's cost 67 per student is \$2.00 per \$1,000 higher that Wilton and they won't be charging less for our students to go there. Plus, they don't have the space for everyone). 68 69 Lisa Post - Lyndeborough: wondered if the budget committee presentation slides were 70 on the website. (yes) 71 72 Jennifer Gagnon - ?? (online): wondered about a breakdown of SRO costs. Is it 73 really \$166,000 for one officer for 10 months, seven hours a day? 74 **Dennis Golding - Wilton (online):** thanked the Budget Committee for getting it done 75 and Marissa for resolving the technical issues. 76 Mary Golding - Wilton (online): wonders about the SRO officer and how the officer is 77 paid during the two summer months (Town of Wilton pays). Thanks everyone. 78 Chair Jones asks if there is anything else from the committee such as adjustments, 79 comments or questions. 80 Adam Lavallee thanks everyone for a good year and states he's glad it's his last public 81 meeting on that side of the table. 82 Kristi LaPlante states that technically the Budget Committee must vote again on its 83 approval of the Budget. 84 **Adam Lavallee** makes the motion to approve the budget of \$15,841,908.00. 85 Michelle Alley seconds the motion. 86 All ayes, with Johnathan Vanderhoof voting nay. Jennifer Bernet and Deb Delworth were 87 absent. 7 ayes -1 nay 88 89 Adam Lavallee moves to adjourn the meeting; Michelle Alley seconds the motion. All 90 ayes 91 The meeting adjourns at 8:24
