The videoconferencing link was published several places including 10 on the meeting agenda. 11 12 Present: The following members participated remotely: Charlie Post, Carol LeBlanc, Brianne Lavallee, 13 Tiffany Cloutier-Cabral and Superintendent Bryan Lane in Media Room. 14 15 The meeting was called to order at 6:02pm. 16 17 **Public Comment** 18 19 There was no public comment to report. 20 Superintendent begins with an explanation of the changes to the side by side spread sheet. The committee 21 had agreed to put in a reduction in supplies with parents picking up \$20 annually and a reduction in field 22 trip transportation with parents picking up \$10 of the cost annually. There were also additional reductions 23 in curriculum. Dr. Heon was able to get the price for the math curriculum \$5,000 less than expected. 24 25 The two options on the spreadsheet are to either have the curriculum coordinator and school counselor both 26 half time or to have the school counselor full time and not have a curriculum coordinator. The two options 27 vary with the reductions in the insurance buffer. 28 29 Mrs. LeBlanc states she willing to present the two options as they are. 30 Mrs. Cloutier-Cabral states she is willing to present the two options to the board. 31 Mrs. Lavallee agrees. 32 Mr. Post inquires as to whether or not there is a preference between options. 33 Mrs. LeBlanc believes that both should be presented. 34 Mrs. Cloutier-Cabral indicates that the committee should present both with a preference to the first. 35 Mr. Post feels that presenting both with no preference stated would be appropriate. 36 Mrs. LeBlanc agrees that the committee does no need to give a preference because there will be a vote. 37 Mrs. Lavallee agrees. 38 Mr. Post questioned what is the best way to present; can put together a chart for each piece to get a graphic 39 representation. 40 Mrs. Cloutier-Cabral believes that the "miscellaneous" does not give enough detail for a true 41 understanding. 42 The Superintendent will clarify this on the spreadsheet. 43 44

Mr. Post goes over the options and wants to discuss which areas of the reductions are sustainable.

The Superintendent identifies that the following reductions are sustainable:

Which are the major structural changes that would create efficiencies that could allow for support of other.

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- Elementary band
- Math curriculum
- Some of the Dues and Fees
- Red Ribbon week speaker
- Health insurance adjustment for non-union employees
 - Alternative Education Specialist position
- Reduction in PE/Health and Music position depending on student course selection
- Field Trip
- Supplies
- Reduction in staff at LCS

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Superintendent indicates that it is possible that some CARES ACT funds for COVID-19 expenses may lower tax rate.

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Public comment will be taken before the vote.

- Principal Brian Bagley asks to go on the record not supporting reductions to staff. School is filled with
- students who need as much support. By creating reductions students are not supported. Once a positon is

67 cut it is not returned.

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- Mrs. Sue Ballou asks if there are any positions that were added this year that were full time in the current budget.
- 71 Mr. Post clarifies that the half time business office position was added but is now in the reductions.
- 72 Mrs. Ballou asks about the school psychologist. The Superintendent clarifies that was done last spring.

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Mrs. Debbie Bass speaks to the need to support students with as many resources as possible. She knows there are students in the community in need.
