
## What is NEWSLETTER FEBRUARY 14TH, The 4th Grade popcorn fundament order to raise f FEORENCE RIDE

## WINTER ART HAPPENINGS WITH MR. LAMERS

#### Kindergarten

The children have been busy exploring the use of geometric shapes to make animals in two and three dimensions. First they drew and then painted a large owl in the winter snow. Currently, they are using model magic to first practice making geometric 3D shapes like a cube, cylinder, cone and sphere. Then they used their skills to make a snail and will be painting them this week!

#### First Grade Art

The children have finished a multi-day printmaking project exploring the ancient Japanese art of Gyotaku. "Gyo" translates to fish in Japanese and "taku" roughly translates to impression or rubbing. This is a form of nature printing which dates back to the 1800's and was used by fishermen to record their catches. Students used various synthetic fish to print, cut the fish print out and glued it onto an underwater scene using a watercolor resist. These can be seen near the office lobby. They are currently doing a great job making folded paper animals using collage techniques.

#### Second Grade Art

Second graders explored 3D shapes creating a turtle using Model Magic. They made a pinch pot and flipped upside down for the turtle's shell, added legs, head and tail then painted a design on the turtle's shell. Jewels were optional to add to the shell, legs or head. A colored under sea or above ground environment was created by folding paper for the turtle to live in. The turtles are in the display case on the second floor. Currently, students are exploring the art of frottage (rubbing) by making a collage template of a silly face of their choice.

#### **Third Grade Art**

Students continued to explore color and value by painting an image of Snowmen at Night inspired by the children's book of the same name. A moon was painted first with light blue to dark blue-violet value changes using tempera paint. Snowmen were painted on and then embellished with faces, scarves, hats and shadows from the bright moon. Third graders just started a recyclable mask project. They were introduced to mask making methods, materials and cultural backgrounds from all over the world.

#### **Fourth Grade Art**

Students are trying to be the best artists they can be by using one point perspective to create a landscape that includes a road and a house. They drew a horizon line and added a dot (vanishing point) in order to use rulers and create a picture in perspective. Diminution of objects (large near, small far away) creates the illusion of space as well. Students used color to explore the concept of atmospheric perspective where objects are darker near the viewer and progressively get lighter in the distance.

#### Fifth Grade Art

The students have been successful in their exploration of landscapes! Using limited colors they painted a Winter Tonal Landscape with only white, blue, turquoise and green paint. The colors were blended with white to create tints representing the shadows that are cast on the snow. They each have colored a figure representing a winter sport and can be seen in the downstairs lobby. Previously the students used watercolors and colored pencils to make a seascape of a New England lighthouse.










#### LIBRARY TIME WITH MS. LOISELLE

We've been very busy in the library recently, reading lots of books during the colder months and working together to make sure they are all coming back and making their way back on the shelves. In class, students have been working hard on new topics and projects. First graders just finished a unit on Caldecott Award winning author Sophie Blackall, studying her writing and illustration techniques. Grade two is learning about different genres, focusing on historical fiction, science fiction, and moving into mysteries. Third graders are writing book reviews for inclusion on our school website. In fourth grade, we are working on a research project which will culminate in a slideshow presentation that emulates a website. And in fifth grade, we will begin working on passion projects, where students will identify an area of interest and design their own creative research projects.
