

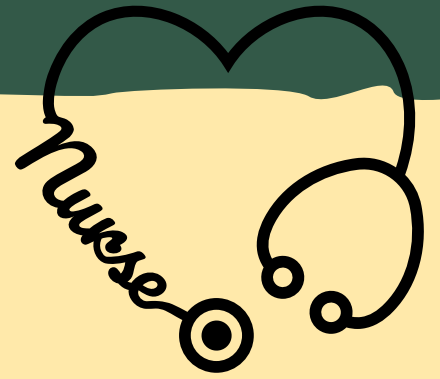

# HEALTH OFFICE



Hello FRES and LCS Families!

I hope everyone had a fantastic holiday vacation and that your students are well rested and back into the swing of things! As we continue through the cold and flu season, I would like to remind parents to please monitor your child(ren) for any ailments as you are our first line of defense in stopping the spread of both viral and bacterial illnesses. We understand this can be difficult for working families, and we are here to support you in any way we can; As a reminder, if your child has a fever or is vomiting, they must be free of these symptoms for 24 hours without the use of medications (tylenol, motrin, antiemetics, etc.) before returning to school; We greatly appreciate your understanding.

January is the second half of the peak lice season. We are asking parents to please put your child(ren)s hair up if possible, as well as discouraging your child from sharing items such as hair ties, headbands, or any other hair accessories. If you have any questions or concerns as to if your child has lice or not, please contact your child's school nurse. Please see link below for DHHS information on protocol.

As we continue through the winter season, please remember that if the external "feels like" temperature is 12°F or higher, your child will be going outside (weather permitting). Please ensure your child has appropriate clothing, including but not limited to: jacket, snow boots, hat, gloves, and snow pants. If your child is not prepared for the outside conditions they may not be able to participate in outdoor recess or play as we have limited winter clothing which is available in the nurse's office. Thank you so much, I hope the New Year treats you and your families well!
